**21, 2015**, at Camden Springs Gracious Retirement Living, 8476 Sheldon Rd., 95624, from 9:00 a.m. – noon.



Annie Brackney will be our speaker on February 6, at 7:30 a.m., at CCSD Admin Bldg. on Elk Grove Blvd.

Annie has been on staff for three years, serving as the Volunteer Coordinator at Wellspring Women's Center for 2.5 years before transitioning into the Development Director role. Wellspring Women's Center was founded in 1987 by two Sisters of Social Service with the mission to "nurture the innate goodness and personal self-esteem of women and their children and to do so within an atmosphere of hospitality with dignity and love."

Wellspring serves as a dropin center to over 200 women and their children each weekday morning, and provides a nutritious breakfast meal, social work services, enrichment classes, and safety net support services. Wellspring started from humble beginnings and has grown to become a trusted neighborhood gathering place that reduces isolation and loneliness.



One of Wellspring Women's Center's programs is "Art of Being." This program includes expressive therapy sessions, crafting classes and art workshops. It offers women many rich opportunities to express themselves creatively. Any woman in the community is welcome to participate, and all activities and materials are offered at no cost.

# Family Favorite for February

Sometimes you just want a quick, easy, comforting dinner that is also really yummy. This family favorite is one of those. The secret is the tomatoes! Sure you can use just any old canned tomatoes, but you'll really be missing out. What makes this dish really delicious are the San Marzano tomatoes. So go ahead and spend a little bit more.... it is totally worth it.

### Ingredients:

 2 to 4 Pork Chops depending on how many you are serving.

- 1 package Spanish or Beef Rice-A-Roni (the San Francisco treat!)
- 1 28oz. can San Marzano tomatoes (I use Cento brand and have bought them at Wal-Mart and Raley's)



2 Tbsp. butter or margarine for Rice-A-Roni preparation

#### Instructions:

 Brown pork chops in a bit of oil in a large frying pan. Remove and set pork chops aside.

- In same frying pan, sauté Rice-A-Roni in 2 Tbsp. butter over medium heat until golden, stirring frequently.
- 3. Add can of tomatoes and the seasoning mix from Rice-A-Roni and mix well, crushing tomatoes. I rinse the can with just a bit of water (maybe ½ -1 cup) and add as well.
- 4. Bring to boil.
- Place the pork chops on top of Rice-A-Roni mixture, cover and reduce heat to low.
- Simmer 15 to 20
  minutes or until rice is
  tender and most of the
  liquid has been absorbed.
