I also want to welcome the new board members. As we all know what an outstanding group of ladies you are, I want to thank each of you for all you will do to help make this the best club in District III.

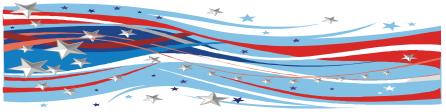

We've Moved

After studying the issue, many discussions and one vote at the SNR Conference in Reno, Nevada, our district lines have been re-drawn. District III not only includes all of the Sacramento area clubs, but encompasses all of the clubs along Highway 50 (in alpha order): Cameron Park/El Dorado Hills, Elk Grove, Greater Sacramento, Metropolitan Sacramento, Placerville, Rancho Cordova, Sacramento, Sacramento North, Sacramento South, and West Sacramento.

Along with that change is the new District III Director for the next biennium, Barbara Smiley from SI Placerville. Barbara works as a manager of clinical volunteers for Snowline Hospice. Congratulations Barbara on your victory!

What Other Soroptimists are Doing

- SI Mackay (Australia) supported a "Real Me Shine" Program, teaching girls at a local school to value themselves and make better choices, through sessions on self-awareness, healthy lifestyles and healthy relationships.
- SI Bangalore (India) Bead to Lead project enables young women to improve their skills and therefore own employment and income. Bead to Lead is a jewelry workshop. The money earned at the end of the workshop allowed the women to send their children to school for a year.
- SI Selby (UK) wanted to make a card that all women and teenagers could carry with contact details for domestic violence, rape crisis and sexual health services numbers. As women at risk of domestic violence are often monitored or controlled by the perpetrators, they needed to find a way to make them acceptable. To do this they added general numbers such as health, police, crime-stoppers, alcohol and drugs, Samaritans and debt services. The cards have been distributed to homeless shelters, drug works, domestic abuse service, health visitors and the local college.
- SI Palm Desert and other clubs in their Region have supported the Soroptimist House of Hope for 32 years; it is a 6-bed, residential and family-style recovery home for women who seek recovery from their substance abuse disorders. This latest fundraiser raised money to donate toiletries for clients.

Red, White and Blue Trifle

The Fourth of July is just around the corner and this is a perfect dessert to celebrate the holiday. In addition to being very simple to put together, it was originally adapted from a Weight Watchers recipe, so there is no reason to feel guilty about having dessert! Brilliant!

Ingredients:

1-10 oz. angel food cake, cut

into 1-inch cubes. Store bought cake makes it a snap to put this together. You could also use pound cake but that would affect the calories, etc. Darn.

2 pints strawberries, sliced 2 pints blueberries

For the cream filling:

6 tbsp. fat-free sweetened condensed milk

11/2 cups cold water

1 package sugar-free white chocolate or vanilla instant pudding mix

12 oz. fat-free frozen whipped topping, thawed

Instructions:

Whisk the condensed milk and water in a bowl. Whisk in the pudding mix for 2 minutes. Let stand for 2 minutes or until softset; fold in the whipped topping.

Arrange half of the cake in the bottom of a 14-cup trifle dish. Sprinkle evenly with a layer of blueberries. Gently spread half of the cream mixture over the blueberries. Top with a layer of strawberries. Layer the remaining cake cubes on top of the strawberries, then add more blueberries and top with the remaining cream mixture. Finish with the remaining strawberries and blueberries, arranging them in a pretty pattern. Cover and refrigerate at least one 1 hour.
