### Facebook 101

Last month we talked about uploading photos, being safe and photo sharing. This time of year many people are taking trips, getaways, cruises, or going on holiday. There may be some pictures that you want to share with your friends. It's really easy.



On your own Facebook page, click on the **Photos** Link. That will open up the box below. Click on the **+Create Album** button and start uploading your photos. Remember to add the name of your album, where you took the photos and any other pertinent information. You can also add **Videos** to your page.



After you upload your photos, you can **Publish** them. This means they will be posted on your Facebook page as a Status Update. If your security options allow other friends to post posts and other updates on your Facebook Timeline, and you are tagged in them, Facebook gives you the option to allow or not allow them on your Facebook page. (This works really well if someone posts an unflattering photo of you.) Click on the link **See Photos Hidden From Timeline** to see which photos are awaiting your approval.



Then you will be given the option to allow them on your Timeline, or to keep them hidden. It's your choice.

Have you seen "#TBT" on someone's page? That means "Throw Back Thursday." Thursday is the day to share old/retro photos of yourself. Or, wait until the next day for "#FF" which means Flashback Friday. Here's a <u>list</u> for all of the days of the week. Have fun with it and share your knowledge with your friends.

#### Santa Fe Cheesecake

Getting ready to celebrate Cinco de Mayo? This could be a great appetizer for your fiesta! Ole'!

#### Ingredients:

1 cup crushed tortilla chips
3 tablespoons melted butter
2 packages (8 oz. each) cream
cheese, softened
2 eggs, lightly beaten
2 cups shredded Monterey

Jack cheese

1 can (4 oz.) chopped green chilies, drained

1 cup sour cream

1 cup chopped sweet yellow pepper

½ cup chopped green onions 1/3 cup chopped tomato

#### Instructions:

In a small bowl, combine tortilla chips and butter; press onto the bottom of a greased 9-inch Springform pan. Place on a baking sheet. Bake at 325° for 15 minutes or until lightly browned.

In a large bowl, beat the cream cheese and eggs on low speed just until combined. Stir in the shredded cheese and green chilies; pour over crust. Bake for 30-35 minutes or until the center is almost set.

Place pan on a wire rack. Spread sour cream over cheesecake. Carefully run a knife around edge of the pan to loosen; cool for 1 hour. Refrigerate overnight.

Remove sides of the pan just before serving. Garnish with yellow peppers, onions and tomato.

Yield: 16-20 servings
