

International Update

A recent focus during the 2011-2012 year for Soroptimist International was "Educate to Lead," with a program tag-line of "Soroptimists educating, empowering, and enabling opportunities for women and girls around the world." Tabulated results include: 93,729 women and girls directly benefitted from Soroptimist "Educate to Lead" projects in 2011. Close to \$4,000,000 was raised to support this work.

From June 2011 to June 2012, Soroptimist

International's permanent representatives to the United Nations, at six major centers, reported attending 19 meetings, submitted 4 written statements, delivered 4 oral statements, and hosted 3 workshops. So you see, we're more than just an Elk Grove club going about our business – we're part of an international influence, with scores of women working diligently to create change for other women and girls in this world of ours!
